**Sixteenth-Century Painting of Officials' Gathering in Yeongbyeon:
A Virtual Tour of the City in Today's North Korea**

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This presentation offers an in-depth examination of *A Gathering of Military Officials* (object number: 2005.74), the earliest dated Korean painting in the collection of the Asian Art Museum of San Francisco. The painting vividly captures the moment and scenery of late 16th-century Korea. Classified under the genre of Gyehoedo (paintings of gatherings) within the broader category of documentary paintings, this hanging scroll depicts a specific event—the gathering of retired royal guards—at a distinct location, Mount Yaksan in Yeongbyeon (a city in present-day North Korea).

Through comparisons with ancient maps and photographs, we will virtually travel back to late 16th-century Mount Yaksan in Yeongbyeon. This painting is highly significant in Korean art history, as it is the only surviving artwork illustrating the city of Yeongbyeon. Moreover, its style and approach toward representing the actual scenery are considered a precursor to the true-view landscape paintings of the 18th century, which depicted notable and scenic sites across Korea.

Important Terms and Names

CHO Yeongseok 조영석 趙榮祐 (1686 - 1761); a poet, calligrapher, and painter

Five representative scripts in East Asian calligraphy; seal, clerical, regular/standard, semi-cursive, and cursive scripts

Gyehoedo 계획도 契會圖; a painting depicting a gathering of literati

Inwang Mountain 인왕산 仁王山; a mountain in central Seoul

JEONG Seon 정선 鄭歡 (1676-1759); an eminent painter during the Joseon dynasty

JEONG Yugil 정유길 鄭惟吉 (1515 -1588, pen name: Imdang 임당 林塘); a scholar officer, who wrote the inscription on the painting, “A Gathering of Military Officials” (object number: 2005.74)

Jingyeong sansu 진경산수 眞景山水; true-view landscape or true-scenery landscape; alternative word of Silgyeong sansu

Joseon dynasty 조선시대 朝鮮時代 (1392-1897)

King Seonjeo 선조 宣祖 (1552 -1608; reigned 1567-1608); the 14th king of the Joseon dynasty

KIM Sowol 김소월 (1902-1934); a poet

Nong'eun-dang 농은당 濃隱堂; Neong'eun Villa, whose owner is not identified; in Seoul, but the exact location is not known either.

Pyeongyang or Pyongyang 평양 平壤; the capital of today's North Korea

Seonjeongwan 선전관 宣傳官; a royal guard and King's messenger during the Joseon dynasty

Seonjeon-ryowu-jaehoe-gwanseo-do 선전료우재회관서도 宣傳僚友再會關西圖;
“Painting of the Reunion of Seonjeon Colleagues in Gwanseo”; title of AAM's painting,
“A Gathering of Military Officials” (object number: 2005.74)

Silgyeong sansu 실경산수 實景山水; real-view landscape, alternative word of Jingyeong sansu

Yaksan 약산 藥山; a mountain in Yeongbyeon city

Yeongbyeon or Yongbyon (or Nyongbyon in North Korean pronunciation) 영변 寧邊;
a city in present-day North Korea

Yujogondon 유조곤돈 柔兆困敦; an ancient cyclical term for the year of Byeongja 병자년
丙子年

Yukgang-hyun 육강현 六岡峴; Yukgang Hill in Seoul; alternative name of Yukgak Hill
