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This is a lecture that highlights women artists coming into the Asian Art Museum's collection since its inception. Spanning from Burkina Faso in West Africa, to Kolkata, Ho Chi Minh City, to Hong Kong, Vancouver, and San Francisco, works by women artists of Asian Descent from all over the world find their home in the Asian Art Museum. Whether it's two-dimensional art on paper or videogames in the extinct VHS format, you will get to learn about them in this lecture. Set up as an introduction to these works, the Curator will share personal encounters with the artists or the stories behind the artwork.

With the Asian Art Museum's newly adopted strategic plan and the founding of the contemporary art department in 2019, Asian American artists are now part of the museum's mission. A special section of the lecture will explore the newly collected works of American artists such as Bernice Bing, Theresa Hak Kyung Cha, and the significance of including them into the overall museum's mission to" inspire and connect us all."
