I. What is the Buddhist wheel of rebirth?

Wheel of Rebirth, cotton painting, 19th c., Tibet, #65356, Rubin Museum of Art

samsāra: "flowing together with" or "undergoing transmigration"

karman/karma: action; all deeds have results

nirvāṇa: extinction, extinguishing Great Demon of Impermanence

Yama (literally: twin), king of underworld

3 poisons: greed (rooster), hatred (snake), delusion (pig)

6 paths: gods (in heaven), demi-gods (asuras), humans, animals, hungry ghosts, hell beings

Mount Sumeru: largest mountain, located at center of world

cycle of dependent origination (pratītya samutpāda)
