Pre-Angkorian period, ca. 6th–8th cent.

Angkorian period, 9th—ca. 15 cent.

Middle (Post-Angkorian) period, ca. 15th–19th cent.

French colonial period, 1863–1953

Kingdom of Cambodia, 1953–1970

Khmer Republic, 1970–1975

Democratic Kampuchea, 1975–1979

People's Republic of Kampuchea, 1979–1989

State of Cambodia, 1989–1993

United Nations Transitional Authority in Cambodia (UNTAC), 1992–1993 (Second)

Kingdom of Cambodia, 1993-present

Selected key terms and names:

- *abhiṣeka* anointing, consecrating, inaugurating by a sprinkling of water; bathing of a divine image
- arcā image, object of worship
- **boramei** spirit guardian
- *deva / devatā* deity
- *linga* ("sign, marker, symbol, or emblem") form/representation most commonly of the Hindu god Shiva as a pillar or cosmic axis, sometimes phallic in appearance
- *mūrti* incarnation, manifestation, embodiment of divinity
- neak tā ancestral tutelary spirit/deity; genies of territories and rural communities
- *pratimā* statue, image, icon, figure, reflection, likeness
- $pratisth\bar{a}$ ceremonies for installation and consecration of images
- *rūpa* form, shape, representation, image, figure
- *unmīlita* eye-opening ceremony in the consecration of images
- *vaśahśarīra* "body in the form of fame" or "body of glory"

Selected names of kings of Angkor:

- Yashovarman I, r. 889–ca. 915
- Jayavarman IV, r. ca. 928–ca. 941

- Rajendravarman, r. ca. 944–968
- Suryavarman II, r. ca. 1113–1149
- Jayavarman VII, r. ca. 1182/3–1218 CE

- Norodom I, king of Cambodia (r. 1860–1904)
- Mongkut / Rama IV, king of Siam (Thailand) (r. 1851–1868)
- Henri Mouhot (1826–1861), naturalist, explorer

- André Malraux (1901–1976) and Clara Malraux (1897–1982), art thieves (etc.)
- George Groslier (1887–1945), curator, painter, author, historian
